Mike was born on New year's day 1954 into a musical family, his father, Cyril, played saxophone in a local band. By the age of three Mike, 'by ear', was picking out melodies on the piano. His family found him a piano teacher but he soon

moved on to the organ. One of his later tutors being the Lowrey organ exponent Jerry Allen. Mike at 12 years of age played the Compton organ at the Granada Grantham. The pedals were just a little out of his reach as too was turning the pages of the music. A note for history, It was mike who gave the last performance on that organ before it was removed to make way for BINGO? Mike's career developed and he became associated with several Italian organ manufactures resulting in frequent trips to Italy. Mike has travelled all around the UK performing and many will have heard his recitals whilst he appeared on the BBC's 'The Organist Entertains'. Mike now lives in Barrowby; he continues to tour the UK entertaining organ society audiences.

David Thomas - Sept 24th 2018

Almost a local boy, David was born in Hornchurch in 1963. He began his interest in music at Secondary School where he took up the Trombone, until then he had been limited to the Descant Recorder whilst attending Primary School. The Trombone led him into the School Orchestras, a Dance Band and later the local Youth Orchestra. In the late 70's he discov-

ered an old "Trench", fold-away Harmonium tucked away in his Grandparent's house and after this sparked an interest he decided he would like to try his hand at something a little more up to date. The years have passed and David's keyboard abilities developed. He has appeared along with many of Britain's Top Organists and at many prestigious venues, played on Radio, and been the subject of Personality Profiles in Home Keyboard Review and other magazines. During the 80's he was voted Second in Organ Player magazine's readers poll as "Most Promising Up And Coming Organist." in 1988 David became the resident Organist for The London Borough of Barking at its Broadway Theatre where he began providing the pure "Dance Music" (Ballroom, Latin, Disco, Sequence and Old Time) for monthly Tea Dances. The winter of 2010 saw David & his wife Teresa take over former Wisbech & District Organ Society and re-brand the shows as KeyNote CONCERTS.

Review of our Recent Concert



Brett Wales 23rd of July and the long hot dry summer of 2018 continued, Brett Wales our musician for the evening was greeted on stage by an audience of 36 Members and 15 guests. Brett who travelled down from Nottingham introduced himself and with a laugh and a joke set about producing an evening of music worthy of a much larger audience. The performance was full, lively and encompassed many

styles. Performers like to turn themselves out attired to impress. Brett played the first half of the concert wearing a dark shirt light jacket and with his hair swept and tied back, he immerged after the interval to whistles cheers and other applause. There was Brett in a flamboyant move suit and a crimson tie, quite a surprise. After the performance ended Brett was of course recalled for an encore itself a medley all received to great applause.
