As an 'upcoming new face' to the circuit he performed a 'warm up spot' before the professional. Steve was well received and in consequence was booked by that Organ Society for a 2 hour concert.

By 2013 Steve found himself booked for 30 concerts with venues including the Channel Islands.

Forthcoming Concert

Rod Pooley 17th Dec 2018 (back by popular demand!)

Born in Welling, Kent, in 1966, the youngest of three sons of Michael and Sheila Pooley. Rod started playing electronic organ at the age of seven years studying under the very capable guidance of John Norris (Principal of the Southern Music Training Centre Bromley). Rod furthered his playing skills by starting piano from the age of ten. Rod at this time was very fortunate to be taught the piano by a top London jazz pianist James Fagg which is no doubt why Rod is an extremely fluent jazz player. Rod passed the eleven plus and went to Chislehurst and Sidcup Grammar School which at that time had one of the largest school music departments in the UK. The school had three full orchestras and Rod's claim to fame was to perform solo in concert at the school in front of former prime minister Sir Edward Heath who was the Bexley MP at that time. While at Grammar School Rod also formed the first jazz band the school had ever had. During and after leaving full time education, Rod has won many major titles in the organ world

Review of our Recent Concert

Tony Stace Oct 22nd 2018



Maybe Tony's reputation preceded him; it must have been a good one? His concert brought a welcome 20 guests along too. Tony produced an evening of entertaining music and perpetual humour. His audience found themselves frequently participating, at times clapping along with the music, swaying in their seats and singing too.

Tony played his trusted 32 year old

Yamaha HX1 organ, one of 8 he owns, though he tried his hardest to sell it to us, along with his CDs and his wife's cakes.

As usual Tony told us exactly how long the next piece would take. We had 8 minutes (with the option of a shorter medley if we didn't like it) of the HX voices turned off and all the sounds coming from an attached midi "Theatre Organ in a Box". Tony hinted that he might pack up touring in 2020, but would carry on doing the Organ Holiday Breaks with Andrew Nix. After a sing along medley for his "last" piece, he ended on an encore medley of patriotic British songs including; Rule Britannia, There always be an England, In an English country garden, White cliffs of Dover.

At the end of the evening the performance had drawn quite a few to their feet to applaud.
