Rod Pooley



Rod Pooley, last with us for our Christmas performance 13th December 2021 often requested, an artiste born Welling, Kent, in 1966. He began playing electronic organ aged seven, added the piano to his playing skills aged ten. Tutored by London jazz pianist, James Fagg, whose jazz no doubt influenced Rod, perhaps why he is now an accomplished jazz player. Rod attended Chislehurst and Sidcup Grammar School. They at that time had one of the largest school music departments in the UK.

Whilst there Rod performed a solo during a concert in front of former prime minister Sir Edward Heath then Mp for Bexley. At the School Rod formed its first jazz band.

During and after leaving full time education he won many titles in the organ world. These included:

1981 at 14 years of age Young Theatre Organist of the Year

1985 and 1986 at 18 and 19 years of age National Organist of the year 1988 at 21 years of age Yamaha Electone Festival Winner

Rod has Grade VIII on Piano and Organ and achieved a performance diploma in electronic organ playing at just 17.

Church organist at St Michaels and All Angels Eastbourne for two years. His professional career was established by the time he left school and he has worked with the Joe Loss Orchestra, the Ken Mackintosh Big Band, Mike Reid and Jimmy Tarbuck.

Forthcoming Concert - Andrew Varley- 25th Apr 2023

Andrew from Southsea, Hampshire lives with wife Sue and two daughters. As a child Andrew's father Frank introduced him to a small Thomas Organ, later changing it for a Lowrey. By age 13 Andrew had become very keen on playing the Electronic Organ. He is largely self taught but received encouragement from the late theatre organist Eric Lord. After awhile in the Retail Business. Andrew joined a Trio playing keyboards in clubs, and provided backing for cabaret artistes in Holiday Clubs.

Married in 1987 he later that year left the Trio. 1988 he started working at 'Bees Music' in Chichester. becoming the Manager of their Southampton branch.

Andrew knew he wanted to be a full time professional so since 1991 he has been playing for dances, private functions, Organ & Keyboard clubs ranging from Yorkshire to the Channel Islands, Cornwall to Norfolk. Andrew has appeared at Organ Festivals at Shorefield, Torquay Bournemouth, Hayling Island and Sandford Park. At the Autumn Cavalcade Festival in 2003, Andrew performed to 1000 people, his largest audience to date. He has played to international audiences in Germany, Italy and Dublin. To date Andrew has made 22 recordings on Yamaha, Technics and Wersi instruments and several tracks have been broadcast by BBC Radios Lancashire, Guernsey, Devon and The Organist Entertains on Radio 2

Last concert - David Thomas 28th Feb 2023

A full and varied concert, David entertained us on his Roland AT100 with its registrations loaded from his larger AT900. At the instrument he produced an extensive range of sounds and styles, and as some said, 'A superb Hammond Organ medley'. He went to some pain explaining and extolling about the instrument, and a short info talk about the development of the Hammond organ, some of which seemed to keep him from the returning to the keyboard. His performance was enhanced by visual images on screen not just of his hands and feet dancing across the keys and pedals but as anticipated, entertaining dancing characters including babies or monkeys.
